The first program would fit into a series where I present music from different time periods from different parts of the world. For this particular program, I chose to present modern music (i.e 20th Century and later) from different continents of the world and I chose to represent America, Britain, Europe, and Asia. As this program is catered to casual listeners, most of the music is fairly tonal in nature, something newcomers can really appreciate. The exception to the tonal rule are the songs *Stripsody*, and *Rain Konnakol* which are comical and rhythmic respectively.
